INITIAL STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR PROPOSED BUILDING STANDARDS OF THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT REGARDING THE 2025 CALIFORNIA BUILDING CODE CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS, TITLE 24, PART 2 (HCD 05/24)

The Administrative Procedure Act (APA) requires that an Initial Statement of Reasons be available to the public upon request when rulemaking action is being undertaken. The following information required by the APA pertains to this particular rulemaking action:

STATEMENT OF SPECIFIC PURPOSE, PROBLEM, RATIONALE and BENEFITS

Government Code Section 11346.2(b)(1) requires a statement of specific purpose of each adoption, amendment, or repeal and the problem the agency intends to address and the rationale for the determination by the agency that each adoption, amendment, or repeal is reasonably necessary to carry out the purpose and address the problem for which it is proposed. The statement shall enumerate the benefits anticipated from the regulatory action, including the benefits or goals provided in the authorizing statute.

California Health and Safety Code (HSC), section 17921(a), directs the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) to propose adoption, amendment, or repeal of building standards for the protection and benefit of public health, safety, and general welfare. HCD has determined the proposed amendments herein, impacting the 2025 California Building Code (CBC) within the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 24, Part 2, are necessary to meet HCD's mandate in HSC, section 17922(a).

The 2025 CBC is based on the 2024 International Building Code (IBC), which will be effective on January 1, 2026. Specific rationale for this proposed rulemaking is provided within the respective items herein.

ITEM 1

Chapter 1, Scope and Administration, Division I, California Administration

HCD proposes to bring forward existing California amendments in Chapter 1, Division 1, from the 2022 California Building Code (CBC) for adoption into the 2025 CBC with modifications as follows:

Section 1.1.1 Title

Rationale: HCD proposes continued adoption of the above referenced section with modification. The proposed modification updates the reference to the IBC from the 2021 IBC to the 2024 IBC to comply with HCD's mandate in HSC, section 17922(a).

HCD proposes to adopt Sections 105.2 ("Building" 1 – 13 only), 107.1, 107.2.1, 107.2.3, 107.2.4, 107.2.5, 107.2.6, 107.2.6.1, 107.2.7; 110.3.1, 110.3.2, 110.3.3, 110.3.4, 110.3.5, 110.3.6, 110.3.7, 110.3.8, 110.3.10, 110.3.11, 110.3.12, and 110.3.12.1 from the 2024 International Building Code (IBC) into the 2025 CBC and bring forward existing California amendments from the 2022 CBC into the 2025 CBC without modification.

HCD proposes to adopt Chapter 2 from the 2024 IBC (except IBC definitions of "Accessible Unit", "Common Use", "Dwelling Unit, Efficiency", "Intended To Be Occupied As A Residence", "Lodging House", "Multilevel Assembly Seating", "Multistory Unit", "Public-Use Areas", "Self-Service Storage Facility", "Type A Unit", and "Type B Unit") and bring forward existing California amendments from the 2022 CBC into the 2025 CBC without modification.

ITEM 4

Chapter 3, Occupancy Classification and Use

HCD proposes to adopt Chapter 3 from the 2024 IBC (except section 308.3) and bring forward existing California amendments from the 2022 CBC into the 2025 CBC with the following modifications:

Section 310.2 Residential Group R-1.

Rationale: HCD proposes to continue to adopt the above referenced model code section with existing amendments. HCD proposes to not adopt "Lodging Houses with more than five guestrooms" in the list of R-1 occupancies in section 310.2, from the 2024 IBC into the 2025 CBC. This section conflicts with the HCD existing definition of *"Lodging House"*. This model code addition also conflicts with an existing HCD amendment, section *310.4.1,* which lists "Lodging houses" as an *R-3.1* occupancy. There is no intended change in regulatory effect.

Section 310.3 Residential Group R-2.

Rationale: HCD proposes to continue to adopt the above referenced model code section with existing amendments. HCD proposes to not adopt the new 2024 IBC condition, "...with more than five guest rooms", to the existing R-2 occupancies, "Hotels" and "Motels

(nontransient)", into the 2025 CBC. This conflicts with HCD's definition for *"Hotel or Motel"*. There is no intended change in regulatory effect.

Section 310.4 Residential Group R-3.

Rationale: HCD proposes to continue to adopt the above referenced model code section with existing amendments. HCD proposes to not adopt the new 2024 IBC condition, "...with more than five guest rooms", to the existing R-3 occupancies, "Hotels" and "Motels (nontransient)", into the 2025 CBC. This conflicts with HCD's definition for *"Hotel or Motel"*. There is no intended change in regulatory effect.

Section 310.4.2 Lodging houses.

Rationale: HCD proposes to remove the reference to the International Residential Code (IRC) and replace it with California Residential Code (CRC). HCD proposes to amend automatic sprinkler system installation requirements and replace "P2904" with a reference to CRC R309.1.1. There is no intended change in regulatory effect.

Rationale: HCD proposes to not adopt the above referenced new 2024 IBC section, 915.4.4 "Interconnection." HCD further proposes to continue adoption of the above referenced existing California amendment, *915.4.5 "Interconnection"*, with modification (renumbering). The 2024 IBC has copied portions of this California amendment, section *915.4.5 "Interconnection"*, but left out the majority of the information in the California amendment. By continuing to adopt the existing California amendment, all the requirements and exceptions will be available for the code user. This amendment provides clarity and consistency for implementation and enforcement. There is no intended change in regulatory effect.

ITEM 12 Chapter 10, Means of Egress

HCD proposes to adopt Chapter 10 from the 2024 IBC (except Section 1009.2.2) and bring forward existing California amendments from the 2022 CBC into the 2025 CBC with the following modifications:

SECTION 1010 DOORS, GATES AND TURNSTILES

1010.1.1 Size of doors.

Rationale: HCD proposes to continue the adoption of the above referenced section with new and existing California amendments. The existing amendments removed IBC references to "Type A" and "Type B" units since California does not currently differentiate among types of dwelling units.

HCD proposes to continue to not adopt 2021 IBC exception (9), renumbered in 2024 IBC to exception (7). This exception allows minimum clear width of 31.75 inches for door openings required to be accessible within Type B units. This exception conflicts with the California accessibility provisions in Chapter 11A, which requires the minimum clear width of door openings in all covered dwelling units to be 32 inches. The existing amendments have been brought forward from the 2022 CBC for adoption into the 2025 CBC. There is no intended change in regulatory effect.

HCD proposes to repeal the previous amendment to the 2024 IBC exception 8, renumbered in 2025 CBC to exception 7 and delete the word "nonadaptable". Furthermore, in coordination with the Division of the State Architect (DSA), HCD proposes to clarify that the exception does not apply to doors intended to be used by people with disabilities.

HCD also proposes to amend 2024 IBC exception 9, renumbered in the 2025 CBC to exception 8, and change the section reference from 421.4.2 of the International Plumbing Code to Section 408.6 of the California Plumbing Code. The International Plumbing Code is not adopted in California, and the appropriate section that has the

requirements for doors serving shower compartments in the 2025 CPC is Section 408.6 "Finished Curb or Threshold". This section was previously Section 408.5 "Finished Curb or Threshold" in the 2022 CPC, due to model code renumbering. The model Code for the California Plumbing Code is the Uniform Plumbing Code. There is no intended change in regulatory effect.

1010.2.3 Hardware height.

Rationale: HCD proposes to adopt the above referenced section with a new California amendment repealing the model code reference to the International Swimming Pool and Spa Code, which HCD does not adopt. There is no intended change in regulatory effect.

SECTION 1011 STAIRWAYS

1011.5.2 Riser height and tread depth

Rationale: In coordination with DSA, HCD proposes to continue the adoption of the above referenced section with a new California amendment. HCD proposes to remove the IBC reference to "Type A" units since California does not currently differentiate among types of dwelling units, and clarify that the height riser and tread depth requirements in this section exclude the stairs intended to be used by people with disabilities. There is no intended change in regulatory effect.

SECTION 1014 HANDRAILS

1014.5 Continuity.

Rationale: HCD proposes to continue to adopt the above referenced section with a new California amendment. HCD proposes to remove the 2024 IBC reference to "Type A units", as California does not currently differentiate among types of dwelling units. There is no intended change in regulatory effect.

SECTION 1015 GUARDS

1015.3 Height

Rationale: HCD proposes to continue to adopt the above referenced section with new and existing California amendments. HCD proposes continued non-adoption of existing model code Exception 1, and non-adoption of new Exception 2. These exceptions permit a 36-inch guard for Group R-3 occupancies and individual dwelling units within Group R-2 occupancies not more than three stories above grade. There is no intended change in regulatory effect.

Repeal of CBC subitem section 4.1 will maintain consistency between the CBC and the CRC.

TECHNICAL, THEORETICAL, AND EMPIRICAL STUDY, REPORT, OR SIMILAR DOCUMENTS

Government Code Section 11346.2(b)(3) requires an identification of each technical, theoretical, and empirical study, report, or similar document, if any, upon which the agency relies in proposing the regulation(s).

2024 IBC

STATEMENT OF JUSTIFICATION FOR PRESCRIPTIVE STANDARDS

Government Code Section 11346.2(b)(1) requires a statement of the reasons why an agency believes any mandates for specific technologies or equipment or prescriptive standards are required.

HSC Section 17922 requires HCD to adopt by reference model building codes, e.g., IBC, which contains prescriptive standards. Prescriptive standards provide the following: explicit guidance for certain mandated requirements; consistent application and enforcement of building standards while also establishing clear design parameters; and ensure compliance with minimum health, safety and welfare standards for owners, occupants and guests.

Performance standards are permitted by state law; however, they must be demonstrated to the satisfaction of the proper enforcing agency.

CONSIDERATION OF REASONABLE ALTERNATIVES

Government Code Section 11346.2(b)(4)(A) requires a description of reasonable alternatives to the regulation and the agency's reasons for rejecting those alternatives. In the case of a regulation that would mandate the use of specific technologies or equipment or prescribe specific action or procedures, the imposition of performance standards shall be considered as an alternate. It is not the intent of this paragraph to require the agency to artificially construct alternatives or describe unreasonable alternatives.

None. There were no alternatives available to HCD. HCD is required by statute to adopt this model code by reference. The proposed amendments are the only reasonable alternative for clarifying the 2025 CBC.

REASONABLE ALTERNATIVES THE AGENCY HAS IDENTIFIED THAT WOULD LESSEN ANY ADVERSE IMPACT ON SMALL BUSINESS

Government Code Section 11346.2(b)(4)(B) requires a description of any reasonable alternatives that have been identified or that have otherwise been identified and brought to the attention of the agency that would lessen any adverse impact on small business.

HCD is required by statute to adopt this model code by reference, however, HCD also has authority to propose additions and deletions to the model code pursuant to HSC Section 17922.

FACTS, EVIDENCE, DOCUMENTS, TESTIMONY, OR OTHER EVIDENCE OF NO SIGNIFICANT ADVERSE IMPACT ON BUSINESS

Government Code Section 11346.2(b)(5)(A) requires the facts, evidence, documents, testimony, or other evidence on which the agency relies to support an initial determination that the action will not have a significant adverse economic impact on business.

HCD did not identify any facts, evidence, documents, testimony, or other substantiation to make an initial determination of significant adverse economic impact on businesses. HCD has determined that this regulatory action would not have a significant adverse economic impact on California business enterprises and individuals, including the ability of California businesses to compete with businesses in other states.

ASSESSMENT OF EFFECT OF REGULATIONS UPON JOBS AND BUSINESS EXPANSION, ELIMINATION OR CREATION

Government Code Sections 11346.2(b)(2) and 11346.3(b)(1)

The Department of Housing and Community Development has assessed whether and to what extent this proposal will affect the following:

- A. The creation or elimination of jobs within the State of California. These regulations will not affect the creation, or cause the elimination, of jobs within the State of California.
- B. The creation of new businesses or the elimination of existing businesses within the State of California.

These regulations will not affect the creation of new businesses or the elimination of existing business within the State of California.

C. The expansion of businesses currently doing business within the State of California.

These regulations will not affect the expansion of businesses currently doing business within the State of California.

D. The benefits of the regulation to the health and welfare of California residents, worker safety, and the state's environment.

The adoption of the 2024 IBC through incorporation by reference with California amendments will provide stakeholders with a code establishing minimum requirements for building systems using prescriptive and performance-related provisions. It is founded on broad-based principles that make possible the use of new materials and new building designs due to California's adoption of the Uniform Plumbing Code, Uniform Mechanical Code, California Energy Code and National Electrical Code, chapters in the IBC addressing these subjects are not adopted. These regulations will also update and improve minimum existing building standards, which will provide increased protection of public health and safety, worker safety and the environment.

ESTIMATED COST OF COMPLIANCE, ESTIMATED POTENTIAL BENEFITS, AND RELATED ASSUMPTIONS USED FOR BUILDING STANDARDS

Government Code Section 11346.2(b)(5)(B)(i) states if a proposed regulation is a building standard, the initial statement of reasons shall include the estimated cost of compliance, the estimated potential benefits, and the related assumptions used to determine the estimates.

- No increased cost of compliance for those regulations that make only technical and nonsubstantive changes.
- Government Code Section 11346.2(b)(5)(B)(ii) provides that the model codes adopted pursuant to HSC Section 18928 shall be exempt from the requirements of Government Code Section 11346.2(b)(5)(B) unless upon request, as specified. The purpose of this rulemaking is to adopt the 2024 IBC which is a model code setting forth requirements for building systems in structures.
- The potential benefits provide clarity for the code users and local enforcing agencies.
- As noted in Section D (Benefits of the Regulation), benefits include protection of public health and safety, worker safety, and the environment.

DUPLICATION OR CONFLICTS WITH FEDERAL REGULATIONS

Government Code Section 11346.2(b)(6) requires a department, board, or commission within the Environmental Protection Agency, the Resources Agency, or the Office of the State Fire Marshal to describe its efforts, in connection with a proposed rulemaking action, to avoid unnecessary duplication or conflicts with federal regulations contained in the Code of Federal Regulations addressing the same issues. These agencies may adopt regulations different from these federal regulations upon a finding of one or more of the following justifications: (A) The differing state regulations are authorized by law and/or (B) The cost of differing state regulations is justified by the benefit to human health, public safety, public welfare, or the environment.

The regulations do not duplicate nor conflict with federal regulations. The State of California has preemptive authority to adopt more restrictive mandatory standards for the construction methods and materials addressed in these regulations.
