- 12. OAH Agenda Item
 - Both Student attorneys and School Districts and their attorneys, need to inform OAH in Due Process Complaint and Mediation Only Requests that Parent(s) requires an interpreter.
- 13. Item Received From Members, Service of Pleadings
 - Service by Email. There is no place to serve parties by email on the <u>Request for Mediation Only by District or Other Public Agency Form,</u> while the <u>Request for Mediation Only by Student</u> form, Email is included under Facsimile. (Item from Northern CA Committee Member Adams)
 - Recommendation that parents are personally served with due process documentation to ensure receipt. (Item from Southern CA Member Kamm)
- 14. When OAH emails a document for parties to view, it is not always easy to locate it on the OAH website and sometimes it can take up to a few minutes to locate the document as the only identifiable information about the document is the Case Number with no case name or document name/type indicated in the email. Apparently on the Labor and Employment side, the document title is listed in the email, but for special education it is not. (Item from Northern Member Adams)

- 15. In a due process decision does the ALJ need to provide or describe all the persons attending the hearing on behalf of the student so that Parents are able to have proper data on particular topics when researching the decisions? (Item from Northern CA Committee Member Padron)
- 16. Recommendation that OAH provide written criteria being used to consider requests for in-person mediations and hearings on a "case-by-case basis" and set a date for discussions regarding in-person mediations and due process hearings. (Item from Southern CA Member Kamm)
- Recommendation that a contact person be named for OAH Advisory
 Committee members rather than the generic OAHSEOps@dgs.ca.gov email
 address. (Item from Southern CA Member Kamm)
- 18. Recommendation that OAH provide a written description of the process by which OAH Advisory Committee recommendations are accepted or rejected, including the specific staff involved and the criteria used – or provide the specific facts showing that the public interest in not disclosing the process outweighs the public interest of disclosure of the process.
