FOURTH QUARTER 2023 – 2024 FISCAL YEAR  
APRIL 1, 2024, THROUGH JUNE 30, 2024**

The Interagency Agreement, referred to as the “IA,” between the California Department of Education and the Office of Administrative Hearings, referred to as “OAH,” requires OAH to report certain information on a quarterly basis. The information included in this report is related to mediations and hearings, as well as information required by state and federal law. Where specific information in this report is identified by reference to a “task,” the “task” refers to a section of the IA by section, paragraph, and subdivision of Exhibit A of the IA.

The information contained in this report for the relative quarter of fiscal year 2023-2024 reflects the current data as of July 2024.

## CLOSED CASES

The data in these tables is required by Task 4.3(b)(3 and 10).

There are times when a decision is issued on expedited issues and a hearing on the remaining issues may not occur during the quarter. This may happen if the parties may reach an agreement on the remaining issues, the party that filed the case may decide to withdraw the case, the hearing may be scheduled for a date after the quarter ends, or there may be another reason. When this happens the number of cases closed because a decision was issued may not be the same as the number of hearings held, which is reported later in this report. An explanation for the difference, when there is one, will be added to explain the difference.

## **CASES WITH DECISIONS ISSUED THAT WERE NOT CLOSED DUE TO DECISION ISSUANCE**

There were two cases in the relevant quarter of the 2023-2024 fiscal year with decisions issued that were not closed due to decision issuance. One dual case had an expedited decision issued during the quarter, then closed due to petitioner withdrawal. One due process hearing with mediation case had a decision issued during the quarter, then remained open after the end of the quarter pending ruling on a motion for sanctions.

There was one case in the third quarter with a decision issued that was not closed due to decision issuance. One dual case had an expedited decision issued during the quarter and remained open for its non-expedited hearing, which is scheduled to be held after the end of the quarter.

There were three cases in the second quarter of the 2023-2024 fiscal year with decisions issued that were not closed due to decision issuance. One dual case had an expedited decision issued during the quarter, then closed because the parties settled, but not at mediation or resolution session. Two dual cases had expedited decisions issued during the quarter and remained open following the end of the quarter for hearings on the non-expedited issues. Both cases closed due to petitioner withdrawal following the end of the quarter.

There were no cases in the first quarter of the 2023-2024 fiscal year with decisions issued that were not closed due to decision issuance.

In the “Resolution Session Outcomes as Reported” table, each number in the “Year to Date” column is the sum of the numbers in the row next to it.

Previously, the method used to calculate the “Number of Resolution Sessions Reported as Not Held or No Data Was Reported” included all requests for due process hearing. Beginning with the second quarter of fiscal year 2023-2024, this calculation was adjusted to comply with Task 4.5 of the IA. The figure for the first quarter has been adjusted accordingly herein.

The method for counting the data point titled "Number of Resolution Sessions Reported as Waived with Intent to Use Mediation in Lieu Of," has been changed in this report. The data point now counts the responses indicating that a resolution session was not held because “The parties agreed to waive the resolution session and participate in mediation.” This data point previously counted the responses indicating that "The parties agreed in writing to waive the resolution session." The reason for this change is because not all matters in which the parties waive resolution meetings proceed to mediation. Accordingly, the figures for the first and second quarters of fiscal year 2023-2024 have been adjusted in this third quarter report.



This change also resulted in an adjustment in the data point titled “Number of Resolution Sessions Reported as Not Held or No Data was Reported.” This additional data point is calculated by subtracting the number indicated in the data point titled “Number of Resolution Sessions Reported as Waived with Intent to use Mediation in Lieu Of” from the number of due process hearing requests filed on behalf of students.

## COMPLIANCE COMPLAINT MEDIATIONS

The data in this table is required under Task 4.3 (a)(2-4).

Beginning on July 1, 2020, OAH began conducting compliance complaint mediations pursuant to the current IA with the California Department of Education, referred to as the "CDE." These mediations are not related to due process mediations and/or hearings.

Compliance complaints alleging a violation of special education law can be filed with the CDE, and the parties to the complaint can participate in mediation.
